
Not Bad for a Boy from Byram

Roanoke Breaks Ground for Substantial Expansion in Aurora



Thanks for all the hard work you do in the GHS newsletter. It's provides a great forum for our thoughts and remembrances. It's the only contact I have with Greenwich. I didn't respond to the questionnaire immediately for several reasons. In high school I never really felt I was college bound, and being an introvert at that age, I made few friends. I thought GHS was a great school, but that I was "just another number". Since I didn't go to any of the activities and I didn't

know anyone well enough, nor get encouragement from the guidance office, I convinced myself that going into the Air Force was the best option I had. I've had a great life but I never felt too connected to GHS until you started publishing the newsletter.

ARE YOU ALREADY RETIRED, IF NOT, WHEN DO YOU PLAN ON RETIRING?

I plan on working for my new employer, Goodrich Aircraft Interior Products, for as long as they'll let me, at least five more years to be vested in their pension.

HOW DID YOU PLAN, OR HOW ARE YOU PLANNING FOR RETIREMENT?

We had no particular plans. I wanted to work for Dictaphone as a technician until I retired. Then came another staff reduction layoff. After 26+ years it was a shock. After many interviews I became aware that age discrimination is real, and hard to prove. I'm so grateful that I found an open-minded employer. I work with people from around the world as an entry-level technician. It seems to be keeping me somewhat youthful, at least until I get home at night. I'm working about 60 hours a week and will be going to Hamburg, Germany this summer with a team to get our A-380 Airbus evacuation slides tested and accepted. What a change of life!

THOUGHTS AND APPROACH ON THE RETIREMENT YEARS?

It will have to be more than just taking naps and criticizing the young people of the world. I hope retirement can be a time of giving back to the community in some way. I'd like to be able to work in my church to show appreciation for the spiritual and social stability we were provided with.

A SECOND HOME OR A MOVE TO A DIFFERENT AREA OF THE COUNTRY?

Our three children and



four grandchildren live in the Phoenix, Arizona area and we've lived here over half our lives. We're here to stay.

WHAT ARE SOME OF THE THINGS THAT YOU ALWAYS WANTED TO DO THAT YOU PUT OFF UNTIL RETIREMENT?

Finish some of the half-done projects lying around (if I can remember what I was trying to accomplish), get rid of stuff so that my kids won't have to figure why I kept it, and travel Arizona to show my wife some of the sights I saw while on remote service calls over the years. I have a Model A Ford and a motorcycle that will need a lot of exercise and upkeep.

ARE YOU LOOKING FORWARD TO RETIREMENT, OR IS IT SOMETHING THAT SCARES YOU?

I'm a little concerned about finances and health. My oldest son got us together with a financial planner last year and that ought to help a lot.

WHAT ARE THE BIGGEST PROBLEMS WE FACE IN THE RETIREMENT YEARS?

I believe Social Security is the single biggest problem. Since we paid into it, I think it's only fair we enjoy the proceeds. The politicians have tweaked it so much we may be the last generation to benefit from it.

Exit 39B (Rt. 7 ext. N. - Danbury) to end. Right at light. Left at 2nd light onto Route 7. Follow to light where Rt. 7 & Rt. 33 intersect. Take a left at the light following Rt. 7. At the next light take a left onto Wolfpit Rd. Take a right at the next light. Go straight at the next stop light. Follow until you see signs for 5 River Road, Stop & Shop Center.

FROM THE MERRITT PARKWAY SOUTHBOUND

Exit 41. Left at light onto Rt. 33. Follow straight until Rt. 33 intersects Rt. 7. At light continue straight. At the next light take a left onto Wolfpit Rd. Take a right at the next light. Go straight at the next stop light. Follow until you see signs for 5 River Road, Stop & Shop Center.
