Died May 14, 2004 at Speare Memorial Hospital in Plymouth following a brief bout with cancer. Peter was born on February 24, 1944 in Greenwich, Conn. the son of the late Benjamin and Thelma Hendley. He resided in Connecticut until he and his family moved to New Hampshire in the late 1980s. While in Connecticut he was a self employed contractor and carpenter who enjoyed remodeling. From Bill Shockley:


