The dealership just "down" from Minchin (space now occupied by the library) was Allen Brothers and later Grassi Cadillac. I remember the building was a bowling alley, and if my memory is correct (I am open to corrections), it was not a regular ten-pin alley, but rather was "Duck-pins" a smaller version of the ten-pin. Other bowling alleys in Greenwich proper (before the one that destroyed the Pickwick Theater), were located on Elm Street and in the YMCA (probably still there). The one on Elm Street was a real throwback to olden

days. I think it had four lanes on the ground level and four in the basement. It wasn't high-tech as a person had to re-set the pins by hand as they were knocked down. Another similar set-up was in the YMCA, which I think only had about 4 lanes. We were not members of the Y, but I recall no one seemed to care that we hung around there and used the lanes when no one else was. Of course, one of us had to "man" the end and re-set pins. The dangerous part being when a friend would shoot a ball down the alley when you were setting the pins! Amazing the things we found by to entertain ourselves when we were kids.

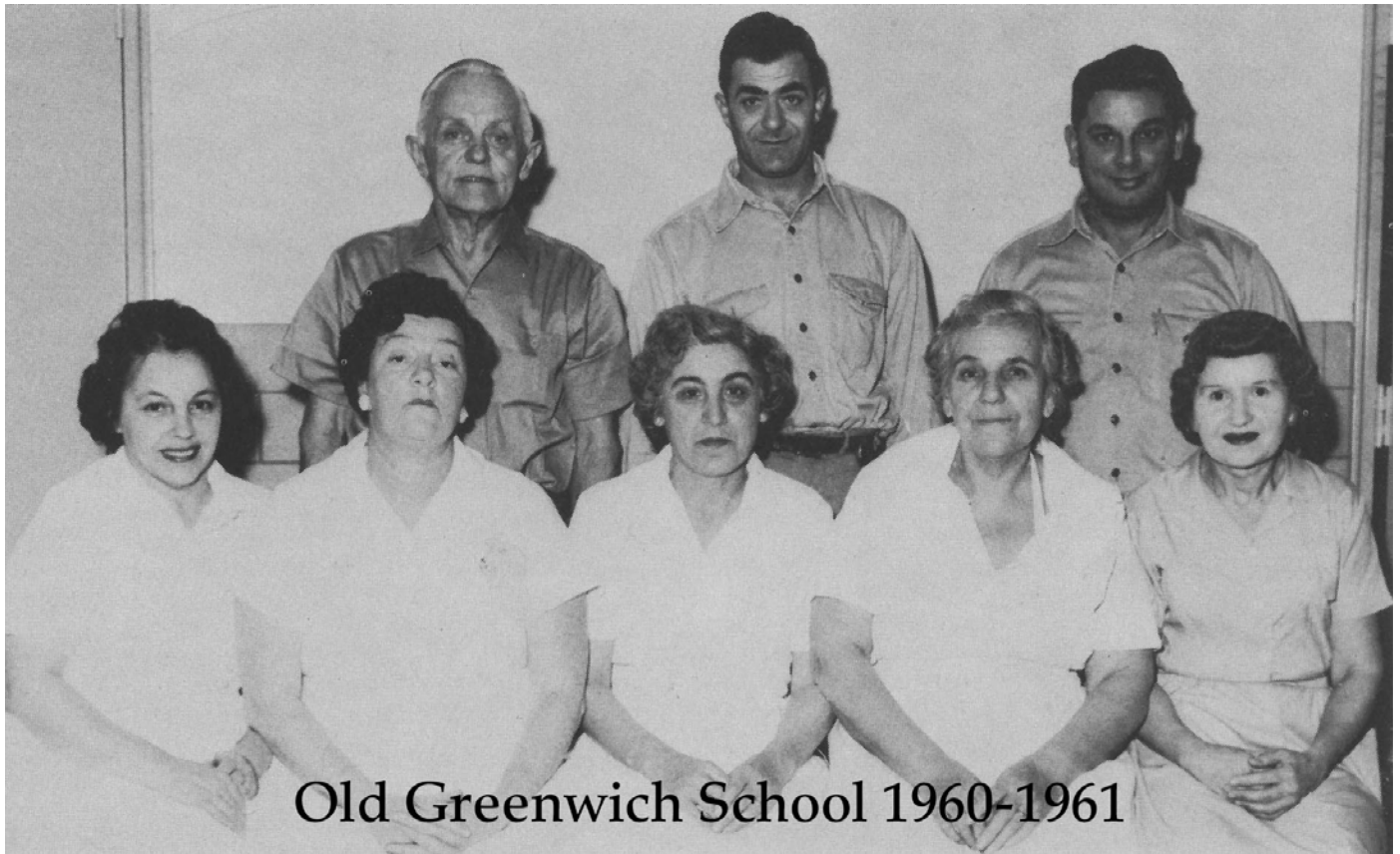
